

# Bread Museum Annual Award

## Rules

**Within the scope of its mission and social responsibility, the Bread Museum institutes an annual prize destined to highlight and disseminate scientific research on bread and bread-making cereals.**

### SCOPE

The award is intended for a research work within the scope of a master's degree dissertation or doctoral thesis about bread and/or cereals for breadmaking, presented in the last three years within one of the triennially awarded thematic areas:

1st year - Nutrition/food.

2nd year - Food engineering.

3rd year - History and other social sciences.

In the 2022/2023 edition, being the first, the scope of the award is Nutrition/food.

### CANDIDATES

The competition is open to researchers, Portuguese or from other nationalities, who are authors of validated master's degree dissertations or doctoral thesis, presented at institutions of higher education in Portugal, and that fall within the annual thematic area of the award.

**The works submitted must meet the following conditions:**

1. Have been academically validated.

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2. The application must be submitted by the author of the research work, proving authorship by sending a copy of a valid identification document (passport or citizen card).
3. Each candidate may only submit one research project.
4. The work must be sent, in digital format, to the email of the Bread Museum [museu@museudopao.pt](mailto:museu@museudopao.pt) by 11:59 pm (GMT+01) on May 18th, 2023.
5. When submitting the work, participants should also include the following information:
  - First and last name(s);
  - Educational establishment;
  - Address (street number, town/city and postal code);
  - Telephone number and e-mail address.

## PRIZE

The winning work will be published in a book, under the seal of the Bread Museum. The winner will also win a stay for two people, for one night, at Hästens Sleep Spa - CBR Boutique Hotel in Coimbra.

The jury's decision will be communicated by e-mail to the winner.

The winning entry will be announced annually and publicly, with the presence of the author, on September 26th of each year, anniversary day of the Bread Museum. The following year's prize will be launched on the same date.

## JURY

The works submitted to the competition will be evaluated by a jury composed of internal and external elements of the Bread Museum.

Jury members:

- Isabel Dinis, Coordinating Professor at the School of Agriculture of the Polytechnic Institute of Coimbra;

- Joel Cleto, Archaeologist, Historian, Heritage Promoter;
- Tiago Quaresma, Director of the Group “O Valor do Tempo”, owner of the Bread Museum;
- Michael Fonseca, Baker at the Bread Museum.

The jury is sovereign, deciding in total autonomy on all matters, from its internal organization until the absolute and relative merit of the work.





The jury may decide not to award the prize.

The jury's decision will be final.

### **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION**

This regulation may be revised by the Bread Museum with the jury members.

All situations omitted in this regulation, which may somehow affect the accomplishment of this contest will be solved by the respective jury.

Participants may exercise their rights of access, rectification, cancellation, and opposition by writing to the Bread Museum. The exercise of the cancellation rights and opposition will result in the elimination of the participation since the detailed information is necessary to manage the participation in the award.
